OVER 750 ENJOY FUN-FILLED DAY OF SHOOTING AND OUTDOOR SPORTS

San Antonio, Texas - On Saturday, September 22nd Students for the Second Amendment and the Collegiate Firearms Instructor Program hosted their third annual, Alamo City Shooting & Outdoor Sportsfest.

Over 750 youngsters, parents, and youth group leaders enjoyed a fun-filled day of shooting, and many other outdoor sports and activities. The event took place at the National Shooting Complex located at 5931 Roft Rd. San Antonio, Texas.

All youngsters aged 18 and younger were admitted free of charge.

Event attendees were able to try their hand at rifle, pistol, shotgun, and muzzleloading rifle shooting. Also, there was archery, orienteering, wildlife exhibits, and historic firearms demonstrations - including a fully-functional Gatling Gun used in the Civil War. Living history re-enactor groups were also on hand to educate the attendees about our past.

Mayor of San Antonio, Phil Hardberger, had proclaimed Saturday, September 22, 2007, National Hunting and Fishing Day in San Antonio, Texas. The mayor's proclamation was in support of the Alamo City Shooting & Outdoor Sportsfest.

Many outdoor sports related organizations actively participated in the event, including: the Houston Safari Club, Texas Parks and Wildlife, Texas Trophy Hunter's Association, Texas Rifle Association, Alamo Arms Collectors, San Antonio Living History Association, and many others.

The Alamo City Shooting & Outdoor Sportsfest is an official NRA Shooting Sports Camp, a National Hunting & Fishing Day event in cooperation with the National Shooting Sports Foundation, and a Trailblazer Adventure Program in cooperation with the U.S. Sportsman's Alliance.

"The purpose of our event is to introduce young people, families, and youth-serving organizations to the safe enjoyment of the shooting sports, as well as many other outdoor sports and activities." said Ryan Bragg, Chairman of Students for the Second Amendment, "Our primary focus here is safety and education."

Stephanie Woodward, Vice Chairman of Events remarked, "It is our belief that our nation is at risk of losing its shooting, hunting, and outdoor heritage. We are committed to reversing the so-called, 'graying' of the outdoor sports community, and to the preservation of those values."
